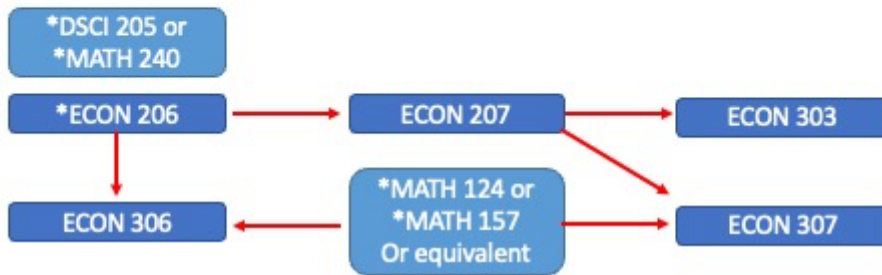

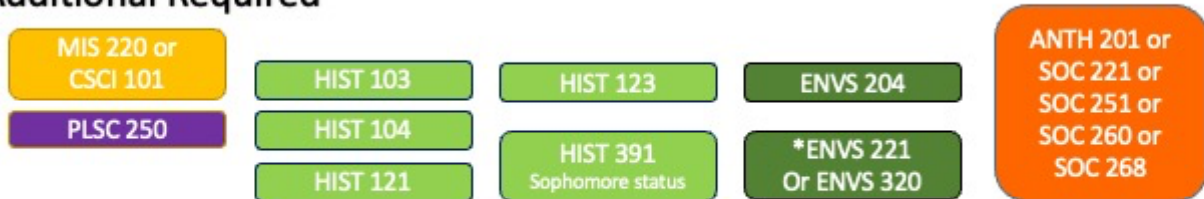

- 2) post-baccalaureate program, or as
- 3) part of the Masters in Teaching degree.
